What makes a Good Neighbor? Since 1980, the Festival has awarded The Good Neighbor Award to individuals who make a difference in the Middleton community and embody what it

means to be a Good Neighbor. The award winners are residents of Middleton who were nominated because of the positive impact they have made in their community and their continuous service to help others.

Paul Braun is a Middleton resident and father of three, who used his professional knowledge working with a mapping company in Sun Prairie to create an organization that uses drones to help children with autism. Autism is a developmental disorder of the brain that affects approximately 1.25 million children in the U.S. These children desperately need social outlets to further their skills but there are few options that can support them in Middleton or even in the greater Madison area. Braun created a volunteer run, nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization called Taking Autism To The Sky (TATTS). TATTS helps to develop social and employment skills for children with autism, by teaching them to build and fly drones. Braun's innovative ideas have clearly made a difference for many autistic children, including his 16-year-old son, and many other families. Braun also serves the community in other ways, including as a former member of the MCPASD Facilities Committee.

Tom Gilbert serves the community as an Eagle Rank Advisor for Scouts BSA Troop 140. He has mentored more than 80 Middleton youth and helped them reach their goals to become Eagle Scout. Under his guidance, they learned to develop their scouting skills and balance the demands of a teenage life.

Gilbert also coordinated the Scouting for Food program for the greater Middleton community. This program collects needed food donations from our area for local food pantries, supporting families in need. When Gilbert is not helping troops, he is very passionate about his involvement with the Crisis/Restoration Center and the Justice System Reform Initiative. His work advocates for a better mental health care system in Dane County. He helps people released from jail re-establish their life and creating paths for success. He assists them in applying for health care, food assistance and connects them with other community resources they might need. As part of his involvement he has presented before the legislature and several Dane County Board committees, Middleton Planning Commission and the Middleton Common Council. Gilbert's leadership brings out the best in others and helps the Middleton community continue to thrive. As the Director of Communications for Middleton-Cross Plains Area School District (MCPASD), Perry Hibner has been an amazing resource in solidifying the School District's relationship with the community. He has a passion for cultivating relationships among district staff, administrators, students, and parents. He represents the MCPASD with respect, integrity and excitement and celebrates the success of our school district and students. Hibner has also made quite the impact on many of the students through his many years of coaching youth basketball, softball and varsity softball. He takes the time to encourage and teach his players at all ages.

In addition to his job at MCPASD he also serves as a Board Member of the MCPASD Education Foundation and the Middleton Community Foundation. He also serves as an usher and reader at St. Bernard's Catholic Church. Perry has worn many different hats over the last 20 years as a volunteer, coach, parent, committee member, director and more and has played all of these roles with great passion for the Middleton Community.

Mathiam Mbow is the owner and instructor of Silver Lining Taekwon-Do in Middleton. He teaches martial arts to children and adults, building confidence and skill. He also teaches them what it means to be a good person, and to always accept others for who they are. He encourages his students to be respectful, hard-working and kind. Many parents have said that they consider him an extension of their family. In his training and business he promotes being your best and giving back to the community and definitely leads by example. Mbow serves the community, teaching many free Self Defense Clinics to women and MHS students. He is a former board member of the MCPASD Education Foundation and contributes to charity events for Madison's Rape Crisis Center and Domestic Abuse Intervention Services and Middleton Outreach Ministry. Mbow arrived in Madison in the late 1990s from Senegal, West Africa with a scholarship to study English at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, and he shares his experience emigrating to the United States and living in Middleton as a person of Islamic faith and as a person of color by speaking frequently on diversity and acceptance of all individuals. Mbow does more than just teach Taekwondo, he teaches and discusses life lessons and qualities of a good person. He is able to connect with a wide range of ages from young toddlers to older adults. He brings families together and helps individuals overcome struggles and grow.

Weekend Kicks Off with Kiddie Parade

The Good Neighbor Festival is a great place to bring kids and grandkids for a weekend of fun. Nearly all activities are absolutely free. While there are exciting activities each day of the festival, Friday night is especially geared toward kids.

The entire festival weekend is kicked off by a Kiddie Parade. The popular event is enjoyed by hundreds of kids each year. Some walk, some ride in their stroller or wagon powered by their parents, some ride their decorated bikes or tricycles and some watch the fun from the sidelines.

The theme of the Festival this year is "Super Hero City-Celebrating Those Who Serve" and kids can have fun dressing up as their favorite comic book super hero or real-life hero, like firefighters, police officers, first responder, military member, teacher or volunteer.


Leckrone to Serve as Festival Parade Marshal

The Good Neighbor Festival Board of Trustees is honored to announce that Michael Leckrone, recently retired Director of Bands at the University of Wisconsin, and a long-time Middleton resident, has accepted the role of Parade Marshal for the 2019 Good Neighbor Festival. Leckrone will lead dozens of entries during the Aug. 25 parade through the streets of downtown Middleton celebrating this year's Festival theme: "Superhero

City: Celebrating Those Who Serve."

Leckrone served for 50 years as Director of the University of Wisconsin Marching Band. He had a remarkable career, serving as a clinician, guest conductor and adjudicator for concert and marching bands throughout the United States and Canada. His experience also includes considerable professional work as an arranger, composer and performer.

Leckrone holds member-



organizations, as well as such honorary fraternities. In 2007 he was presented with a "Lifetime Achievement Award" by the Wisconsin Foundation for School Music (this was only the second time this preeminent award had been conferred), in 2010 the Wisconsin State Historical society presented him with the "Spencer Tracy Award for Distinction in the Performing Arts," and in 2013 the Madison Area Music Association named him the recipient of the Michael St. John Lifetime Achievement Award.

He has composed or arranged music for numerous high school and university bands, and over 200 of his arrangements and compositions for marching band and concert band have been published. He is also the author of two texts for use by marching band directors, a handbook for band arranging, and a text dealing with popular music in the United States.

This will be Leckrone's fourth time leading the Good Neighbor Festival parade. The first time was in 1983, as part of the festival's "Music! Music!



Music!" theme. That year, Leckrone was parade marshal along with the band directors of Middleton High School and Kromrey Middle School-Vern Pieper and Lois Gurske. He also served as Parade Marshal in 1995 with the theme "Middleton's Greatest Hits," and in 2005 with the theme "Rock Around the Clock." His repeat engagements in the role of parade marshal are a testament to his lengthy career and popularity in the community.

The festival's annual pa-

rade will be held on Aug. 25 at noon. The route begins on University Ave., heads West to Parmenter St., and ends at the festival grounds at Firemen's Park. Get there early and get a good spot to see Leckrone and dozens of entertaining parade units, including the Middleton High School Marching Band and Dance Team, Forward! Marching Band, Black Star Drum Line, Tundra Drum Line, Cripple Creek Cloggers, Stilt Walkers and German Wheel Performers, Sauk Prairie Marching Band, UW Cheerleading and Bucky Badger, and the Zor Shrine Clowns. Numerous area businesses and non-profit organizations will also participate in the parade, with lots of treats and fun for younger parade-goers. The public and a panel of judges will select entries for awards in various categories, based on entertainment value and how well they express the theme.




The funds raised during the festival allow Middleton Youth Hockey to provide hockey scholarships and equipment for community
